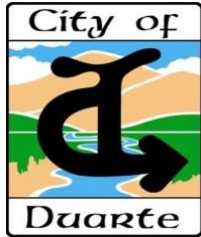

RE: SUPPORT FOR BUDGET ALLOCATION OF \$100,000,000 IN GENERAL FUNDS FOR THE SAN GABRIEL VALLEY REGIONAL HOUSING TRUST

Dear Senator Skinner & Assemblyman Ting:

The City of Duarte strongly supports the one-time FY 2022-23 budget allocation request submitted by Senator Susan Rubio seeking \$100,000,000 from the General Fund to fund the planning and construction of affordable and homeless housing in the San Gabriel Valley. This funding would be instrumental in addressing the affordable housing shortage and homeless crisis in our region of 31 cities located in eastern Los Angeles County.

The San Gabriel Valley Regional Housing Trust (SGVRHT) is a joint powers authority established in February 2020 by legislation authored by Senator Susan Rubio. In its first two years, the SGVRHT has successfully leveraged local resources to secure two state matching grants, developed the first tiny home bridge housing site in the San Gabriel Valley, and funded 552 affordable and permanent supportive housing units in 8 cities. The SGVRHT aims to provide a turnkey approach for project development, supporting projects from inception to completion with predevelopment technical assistance, acquisition and construction loans, and permanent financing. With an average investment of \$21,204 per unit, every dollar invested by the SGVRHT leverages \$22 in additional investment.

In just two years, the SGVRHT has already demonstrated how it can successfully leverage other funds to help finance and construct affordable housing units. An investment of this magnitude would serve as a catalyst to attract private capital and additional investment in housing development for at-risk residents of the San Gabriel Valley. We urge that this robust state investment be provided to support the cooperative, proactive efforts by the communities of the San Gabriel Valley to address the need for affordable and homeless housing.

The City of Duarte strongly supports the request submitted to your office by the San Gabriel Valley Regional Housing Trust (SGVRHT) seeking \$10,000,000 in Fiscal Year 2023 Economic Development Initiatives funds to help finance and construct projects on the San Gabriel Valley Project Pipeline. This funding would be instrumental in providing gap financing to develop the 440 units currently in the pipeline, provide operational funding to support 105 interim housing beds, and expand the revolving loan fund which will provide ongoing sustainable financing for the SGVRHT.

SUBJECT: Consideration of Draft Redistricting Maps and First Reading of Ordinance No. 909 Amending Chapter 2.02 of the Duarte Municipal Code Regarding By-District Elections and Adopting a New City Council Electoral District Map

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Review and consider draft maps; and 2) Introduce Ordinance No. 909 amending Chapter 2.02 of the Duarte Municipal Code regarding by-district elections and adopting a new City Council electoral district map for first reading.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

BACKGROUND

As required by the California Elections Code, cities with by-district election systems must use new census data to review and, if needed, redraw district lines to reflect how local populations have changed every ten years. This process, called redistricting, ensures all districts have nearly equal population. The redistricting process for the City of Duarte must be completed by April 17, 2022. The City has previously held six public hearings to receive public input and discuss draft maps.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

The public was invited to submit input regarding district boundaries using either a paper map or an online redistricting tool which was provided by the City's demographer, National Demographic Corporation (NDC). At the sixth public hearing on March 22, 2022, the City Council the City Council determined that Map 103 Revised is compliant with Elections Code Section 21601 and all other provisions of the Fair Maps Act and voted to direct City staff to prepare an ordinance to adopt Map 103 Revised as its new City Council electoral district map. Subsequently, two additional maps, Hand-Drawn Map 1 and Hand-Drawn Map 2, were submitted by the public for consideration. Both maps were posted on the City's redistricting website on March 28, 2022 in accordance with the Fair Maps Act. All draft maps are being presented to the City Council for review and consideration at this meeting.

To be considered a viable map, draft maps must be evaluated based on Federal and California redistricting criteria such as equal population, no racial gerrymandering, contiguous geography easily identifiable boundaries where practicable, and no favoring or discriminating against a political party. Other traditional redistricting principals such as respect of voter choices, future

population growth, minimizing voter election year disruptions and preserving the core of existing districts may also be considered in the evaluation of draft maps.

Language Requirements for Redistricting

Per Elections Code § 21608, the City must provide language services in applicable languages, as provided by the Secretary of State. Pursuant to Elections Code § 21608(h) applicable language requirements for city redistricting purposes include any language that is spoken by a group of city residents with limited English proficiency who constitute 3 percent or more of the city's total population over four years of age for whom language can be determined.

On June 11, 2021, the Secretary of State released guidance for cities regarding these language requirements. In addition to English, the City of Duarte is required to provide qualifying materials and "live translation" (interpretation) services in Spanish and Chinese (Mandarin/Cantonese) upon a request made by the Thursday prior to a hearing or workshop.

RECOMMENDATION

1) Review and consider draft maps; and 2) Introduce Ordinance No. 909 amending Chapter 2.02 of the Duarte Municipal Code regarding by-district elections and adopting a new City Council electoral district map for first reading.

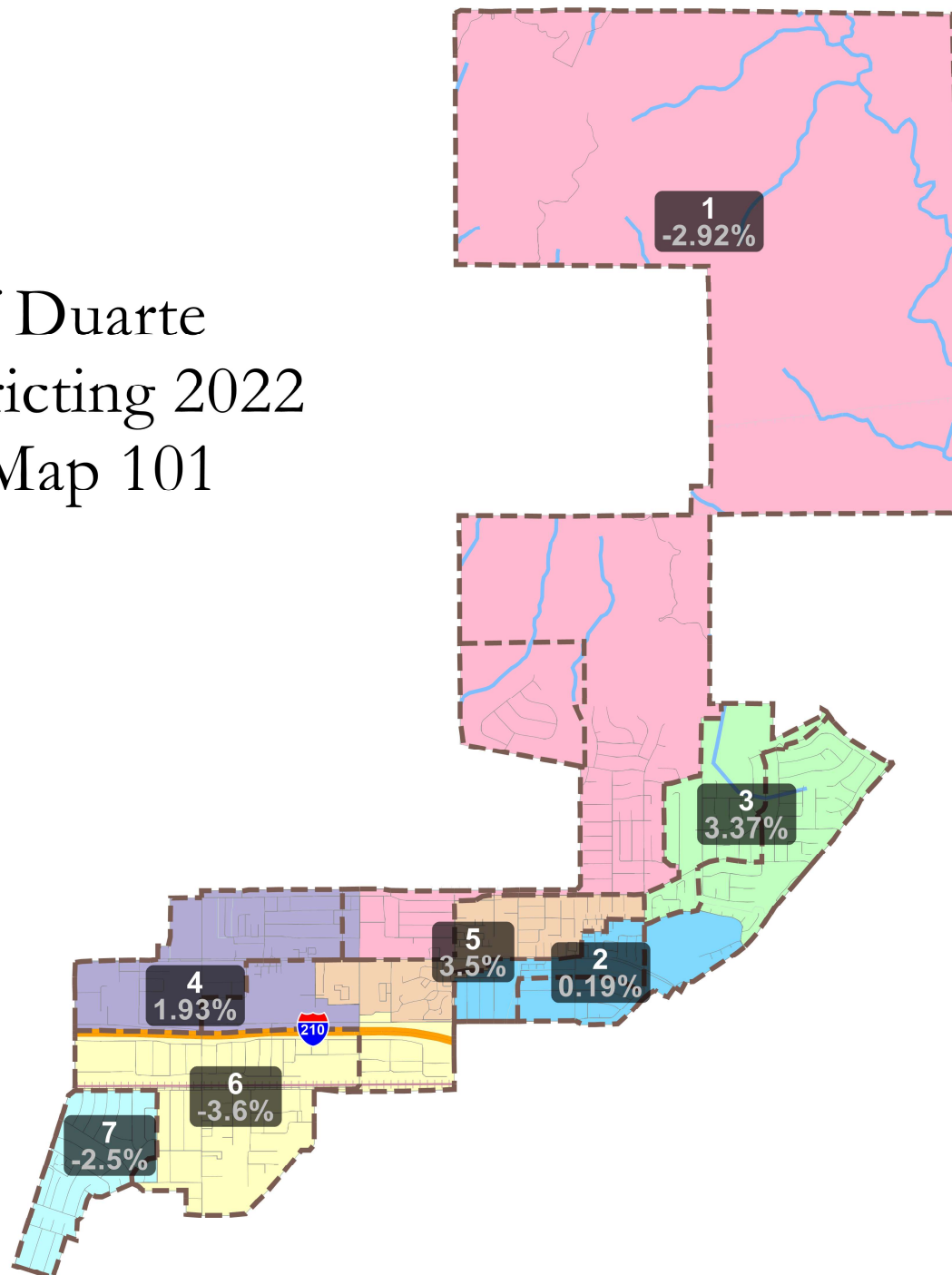

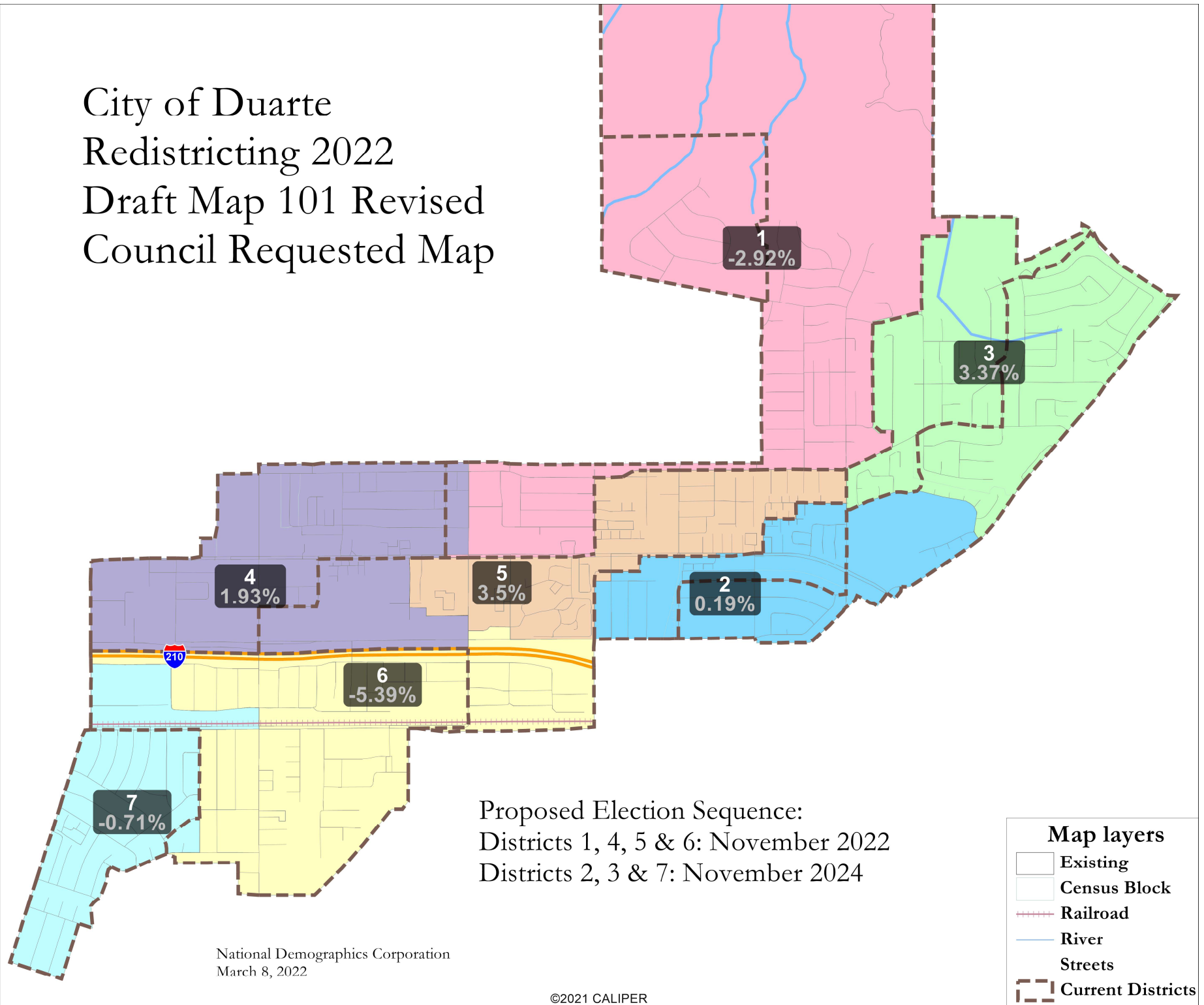

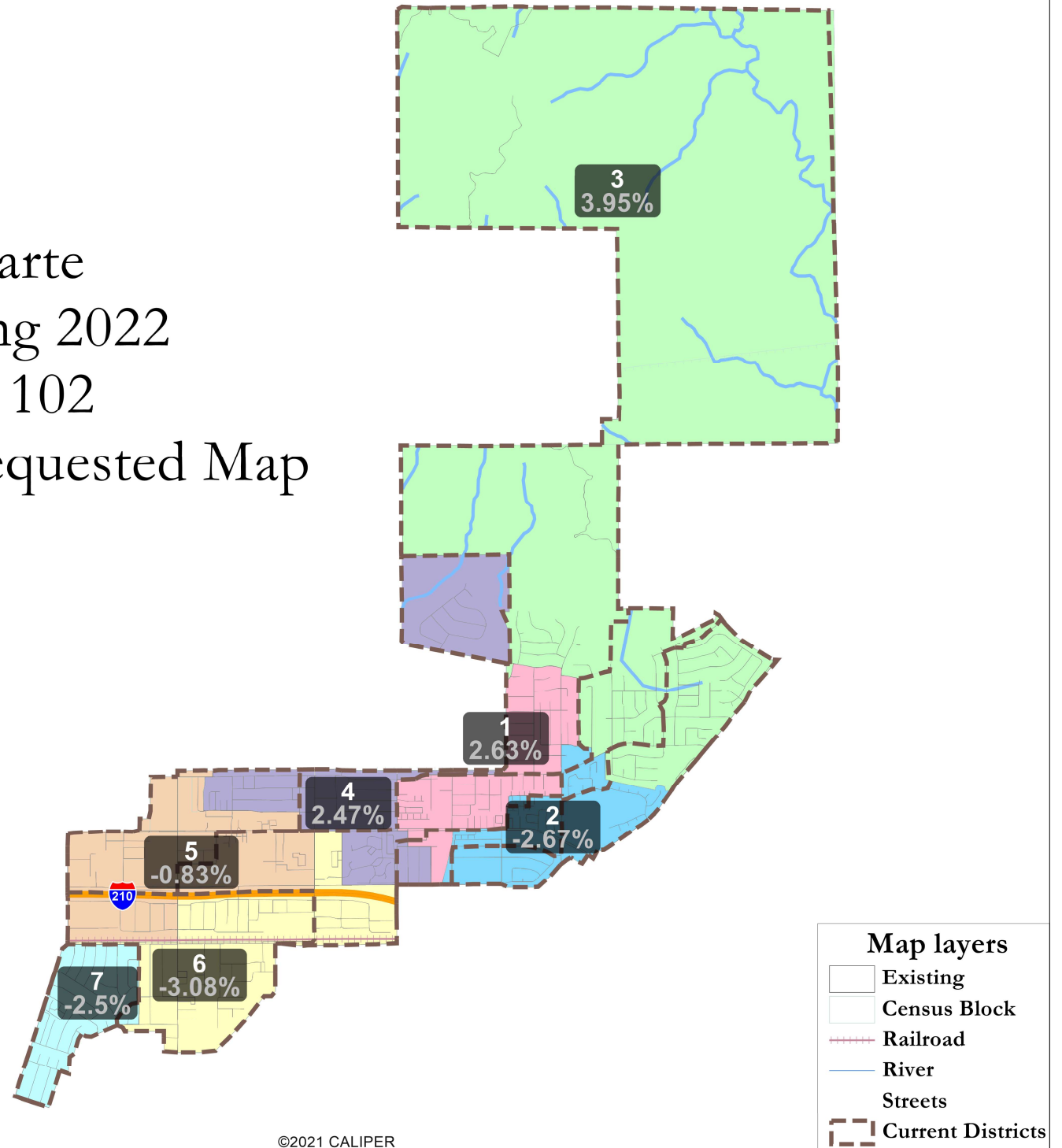

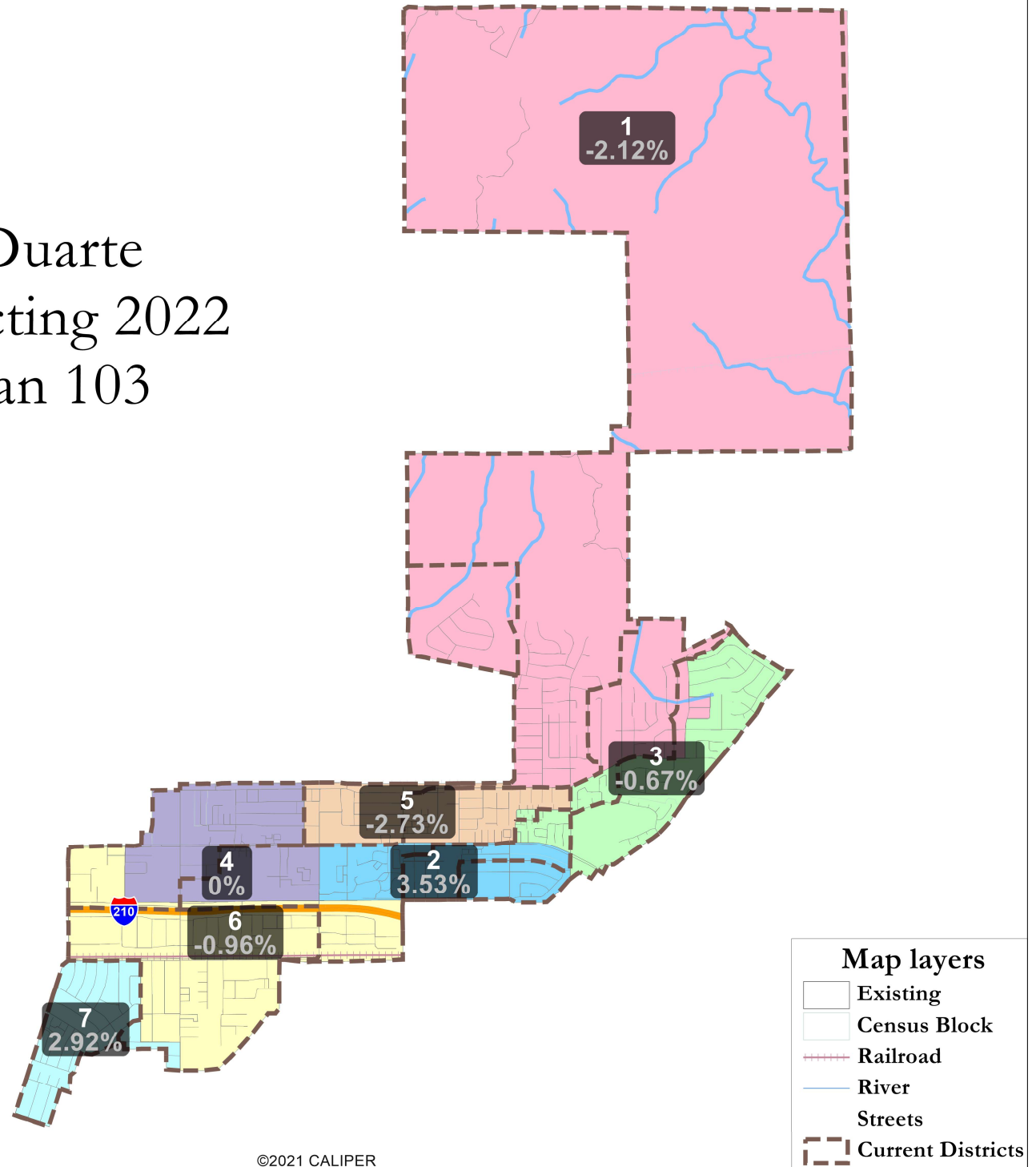
City of Duarte Redistricting 2022 Draft Map 101 Revised Council Requested Map



City of Duarte Redistricting 2022 Draft Map 102 Council Requested Map

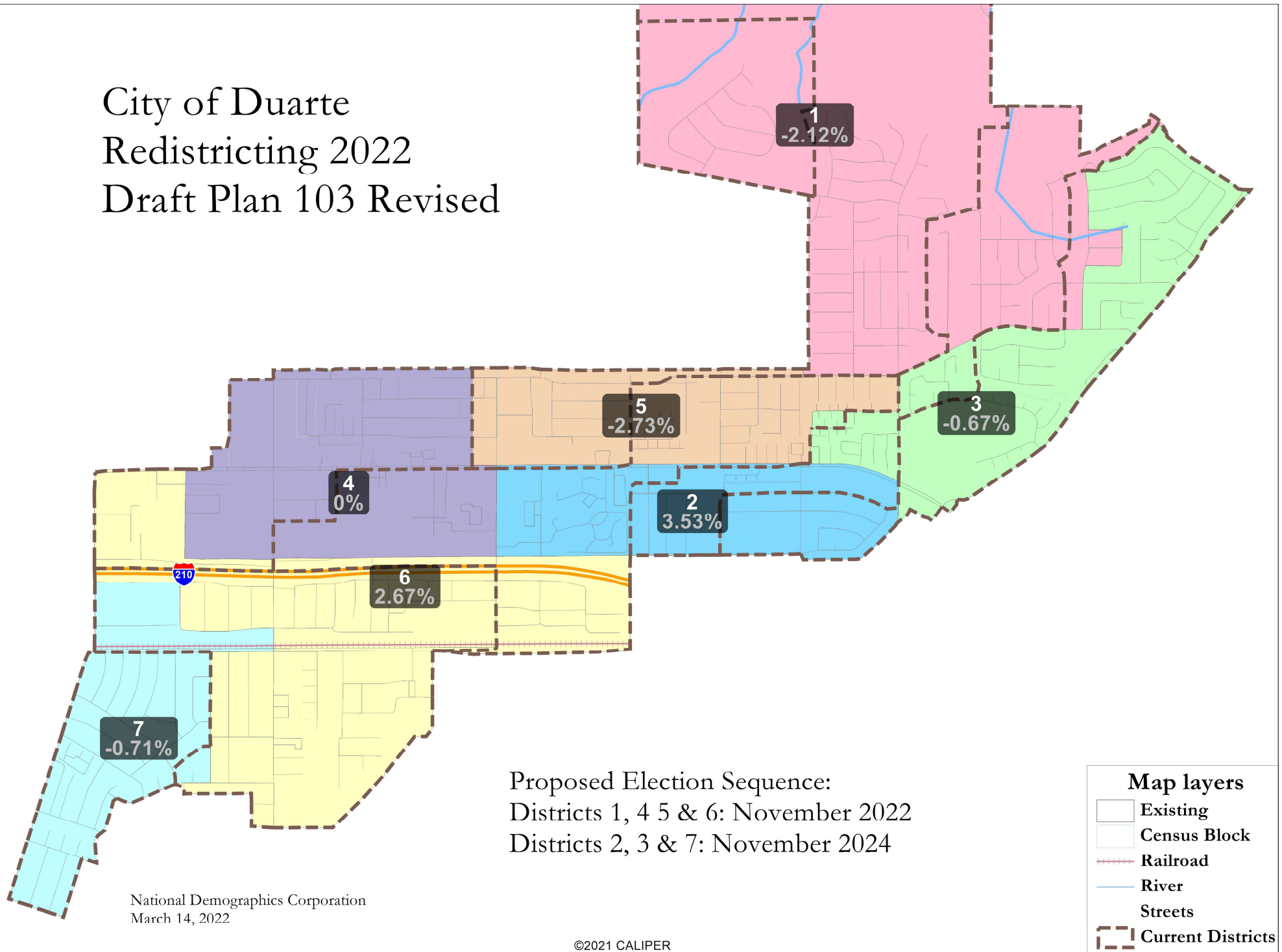

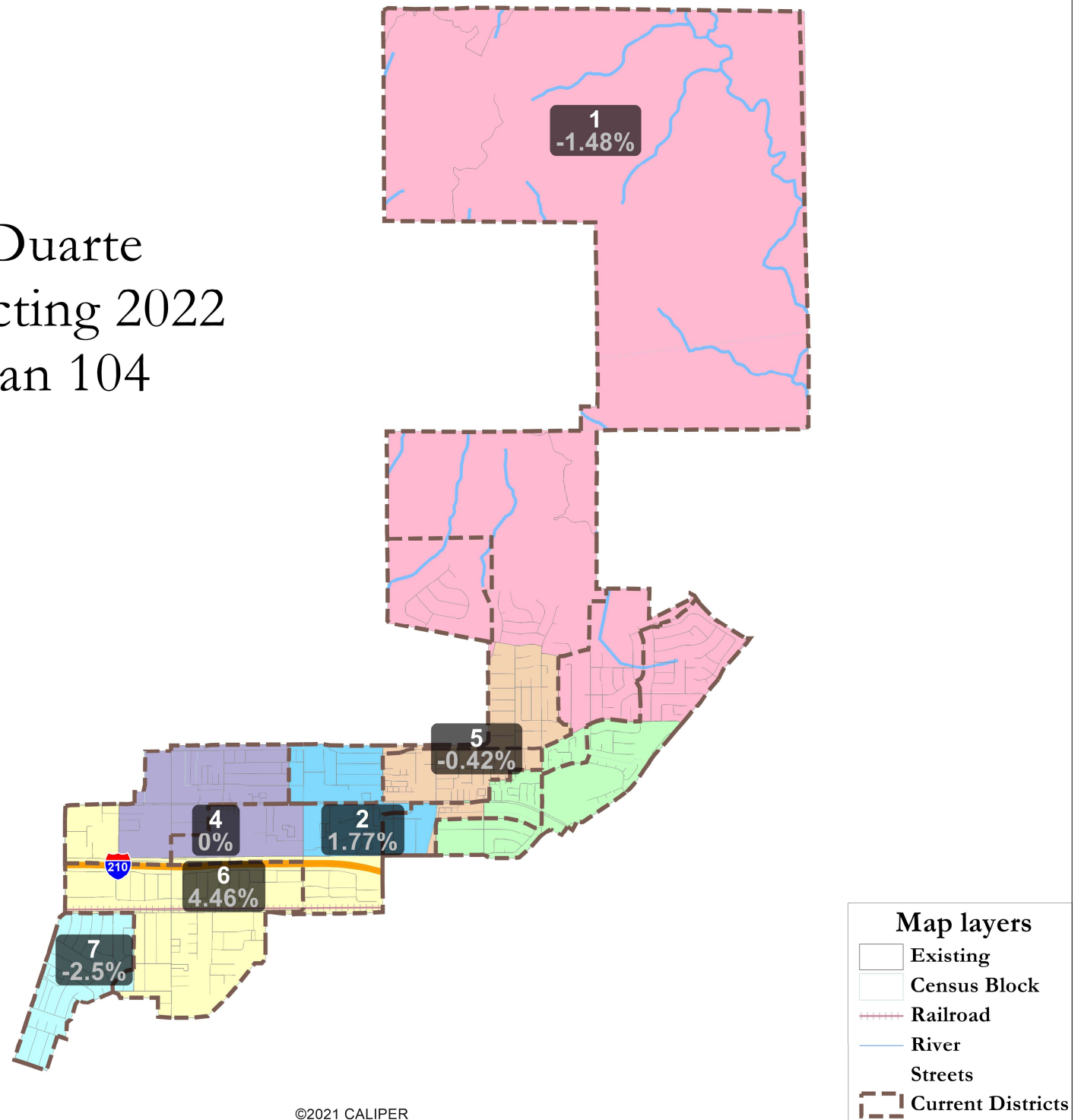

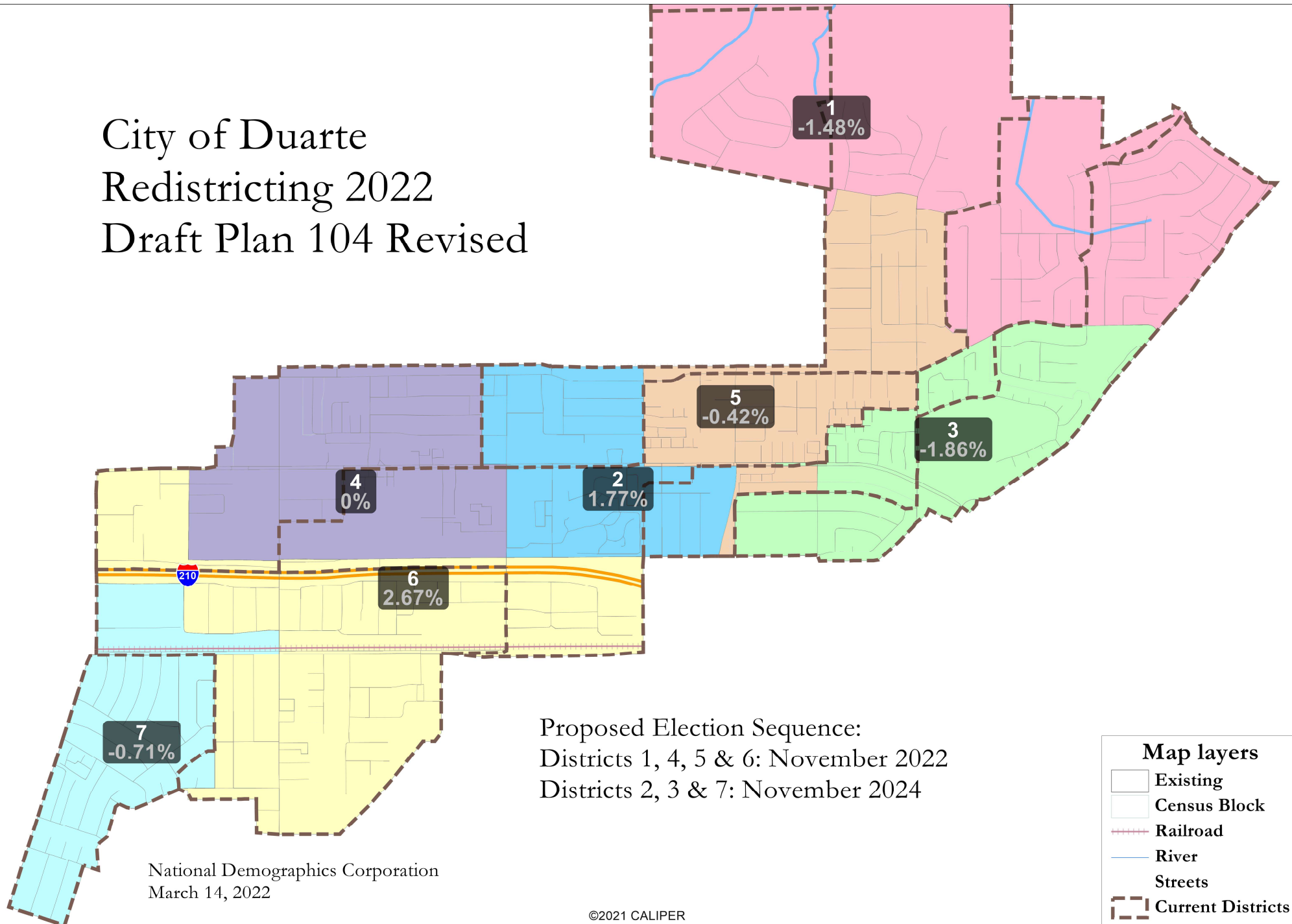

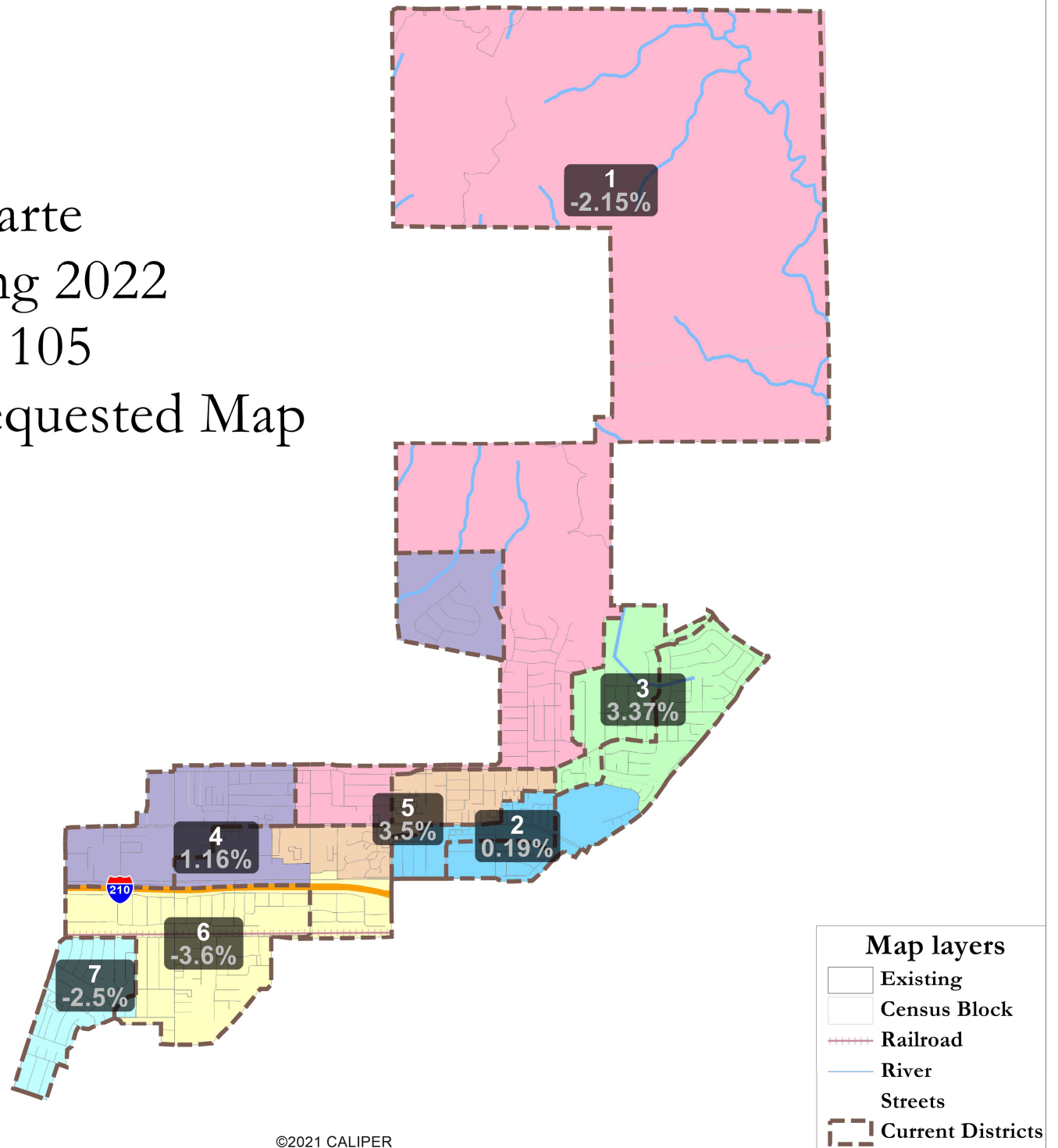

City of Duarte Redistricting 2022 Draft Plan 104 Revised

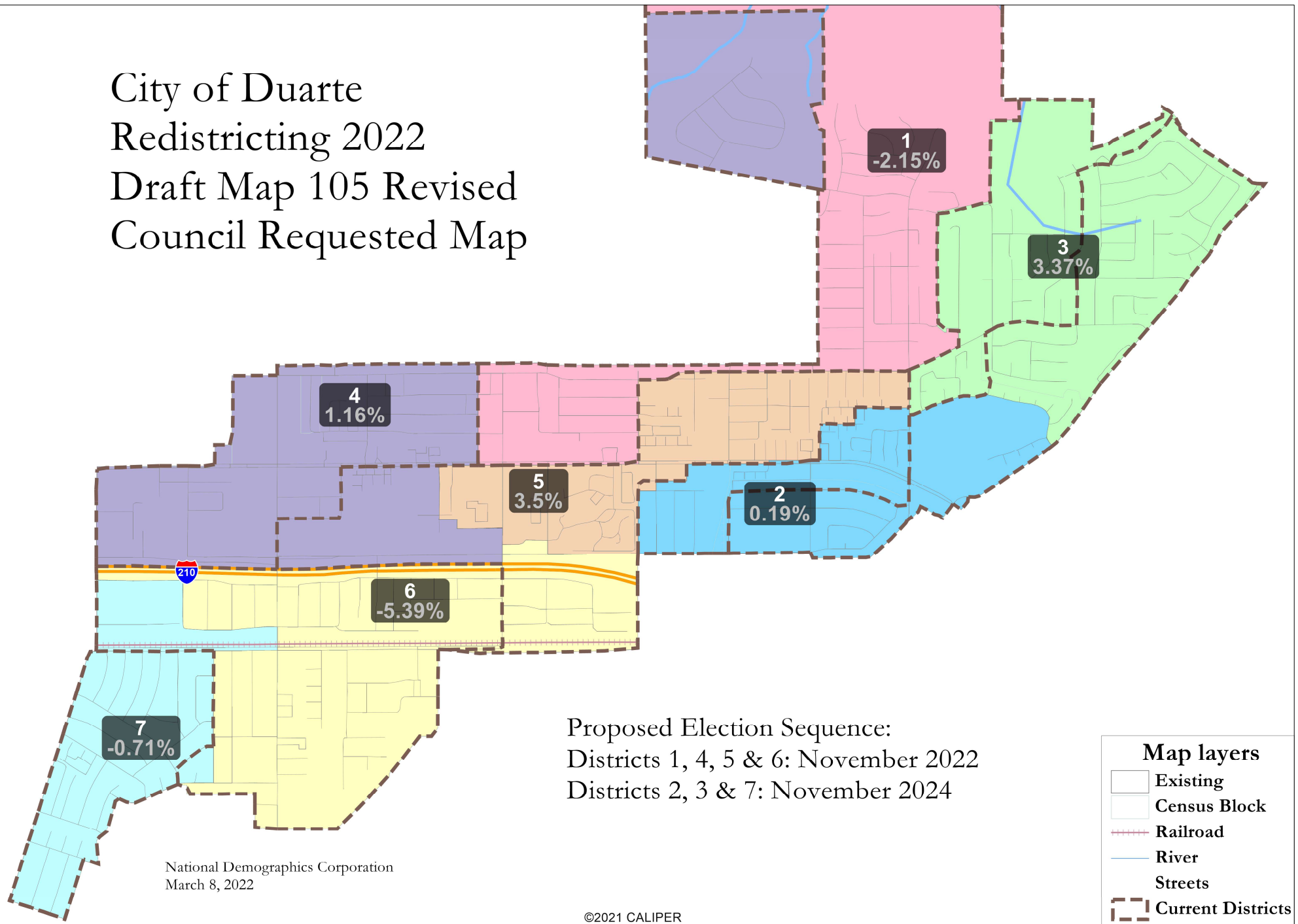


City of Duarte Redistricting 2022 Draft Map 105 Council Requested Map



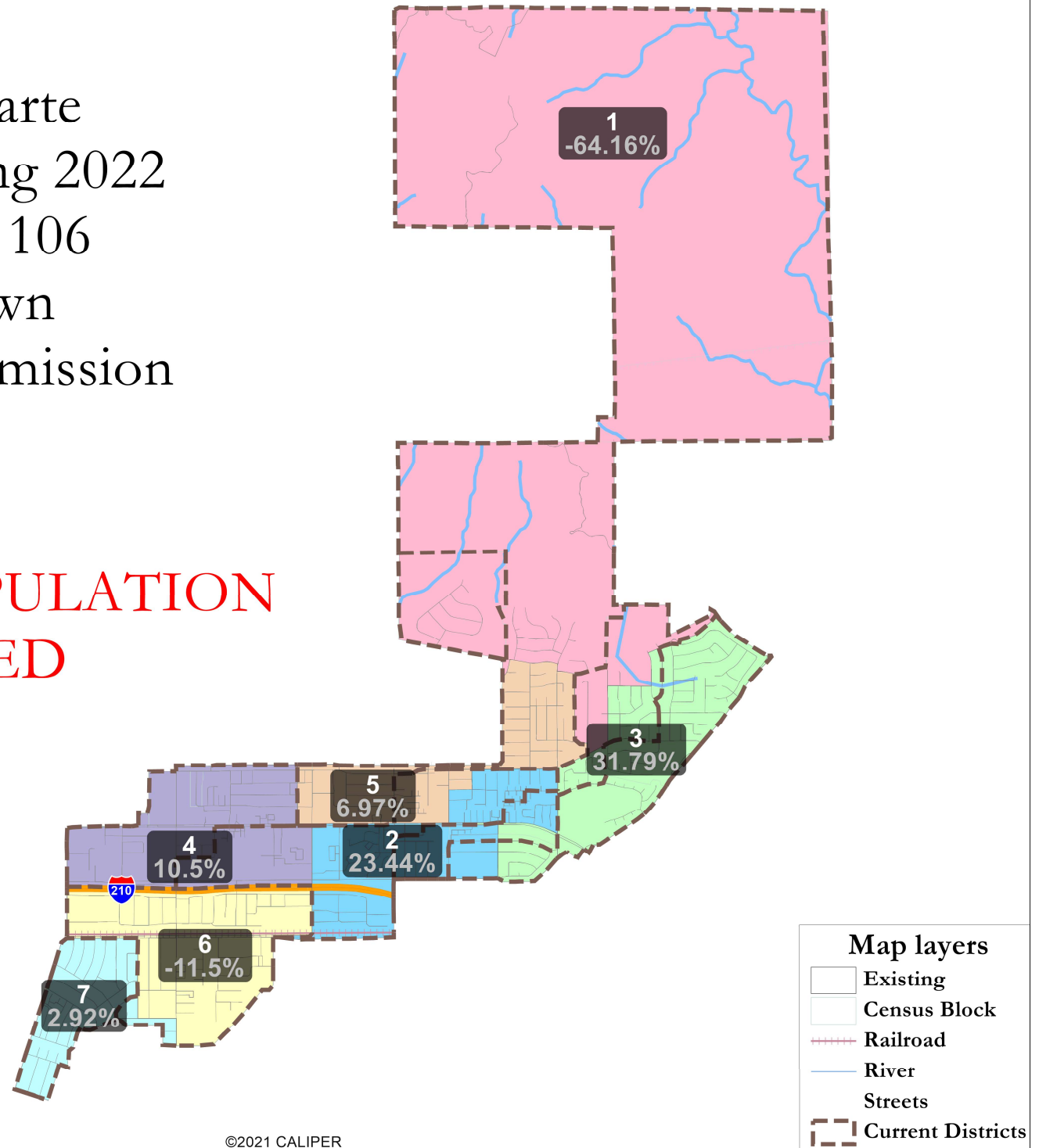

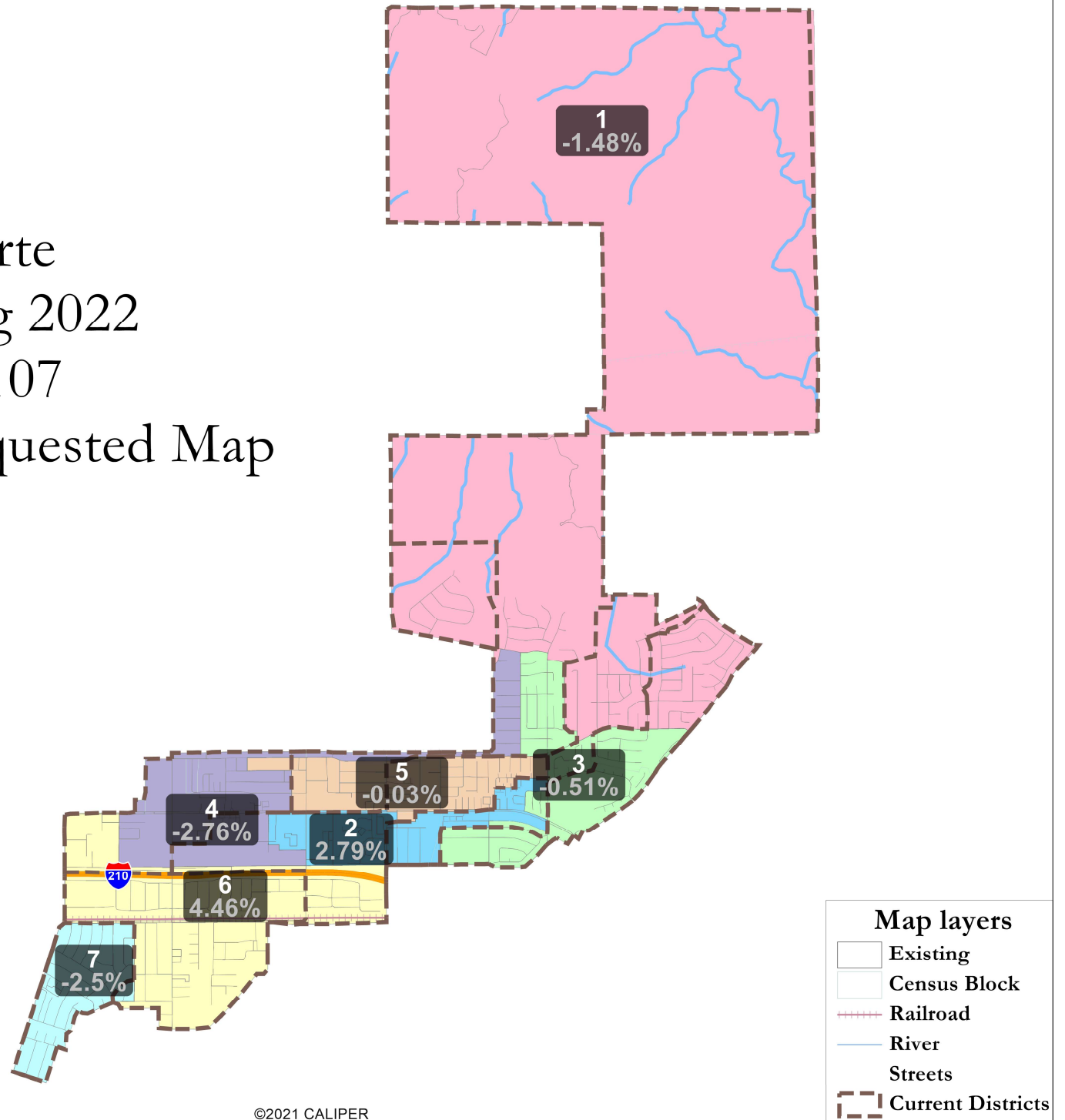

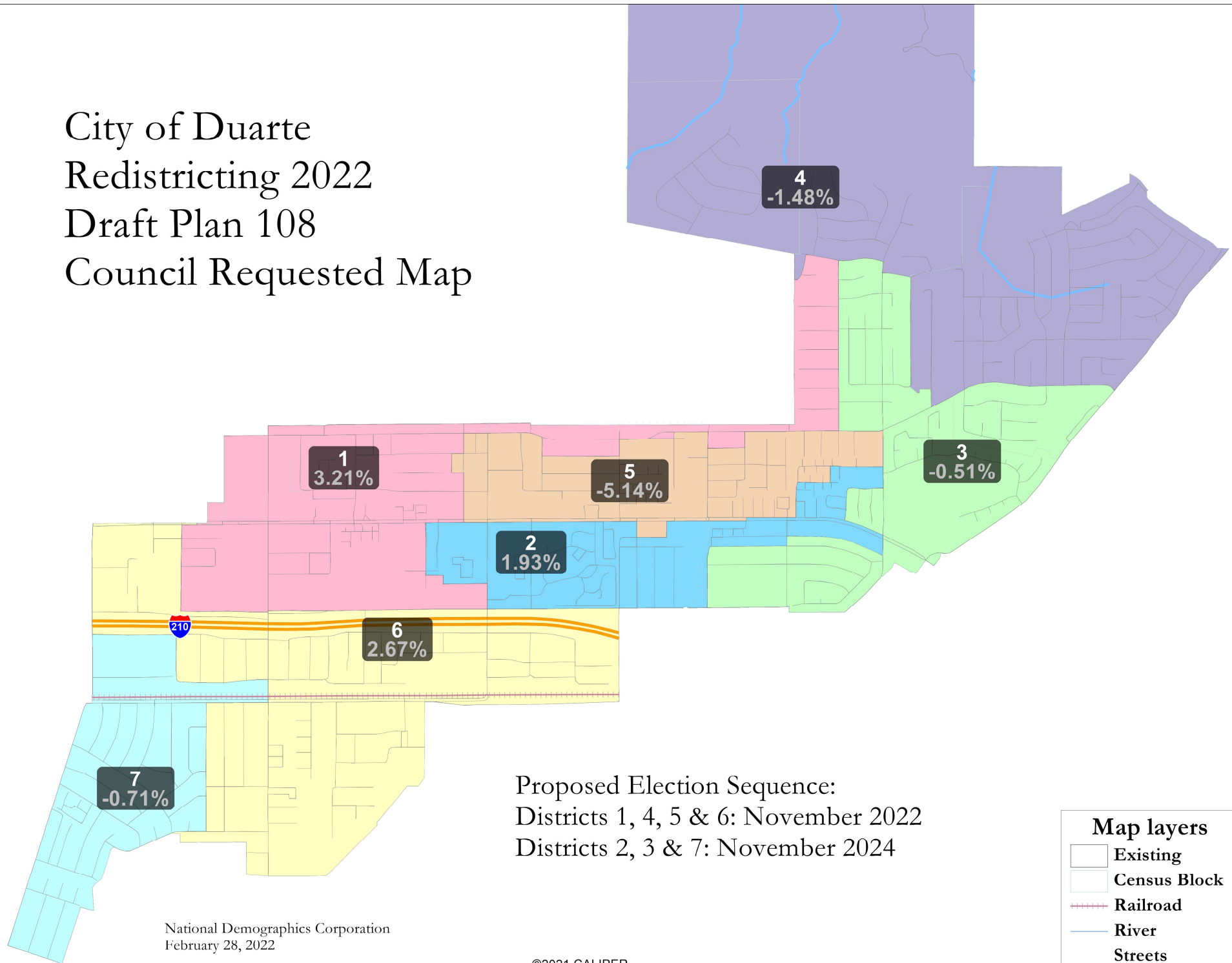

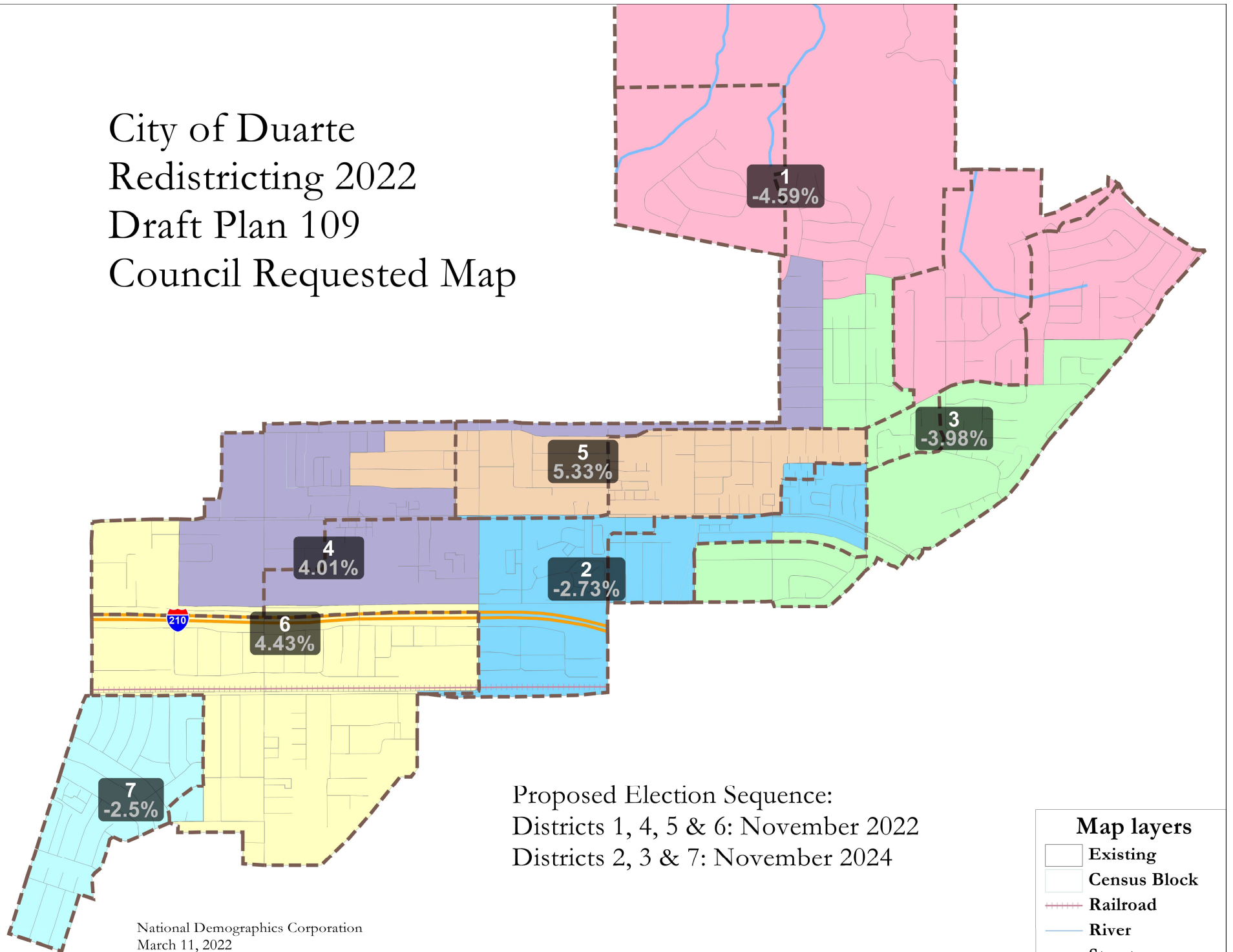

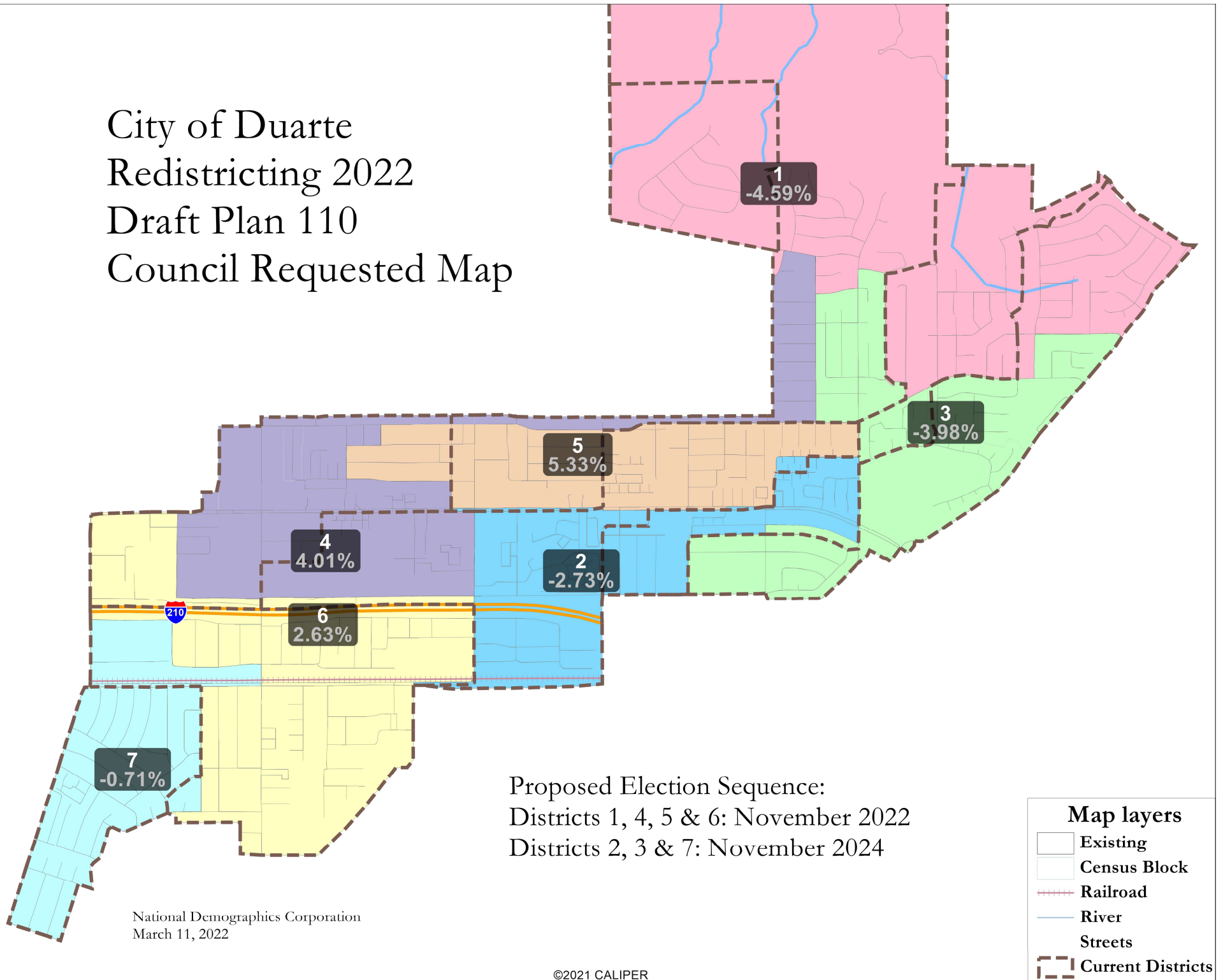

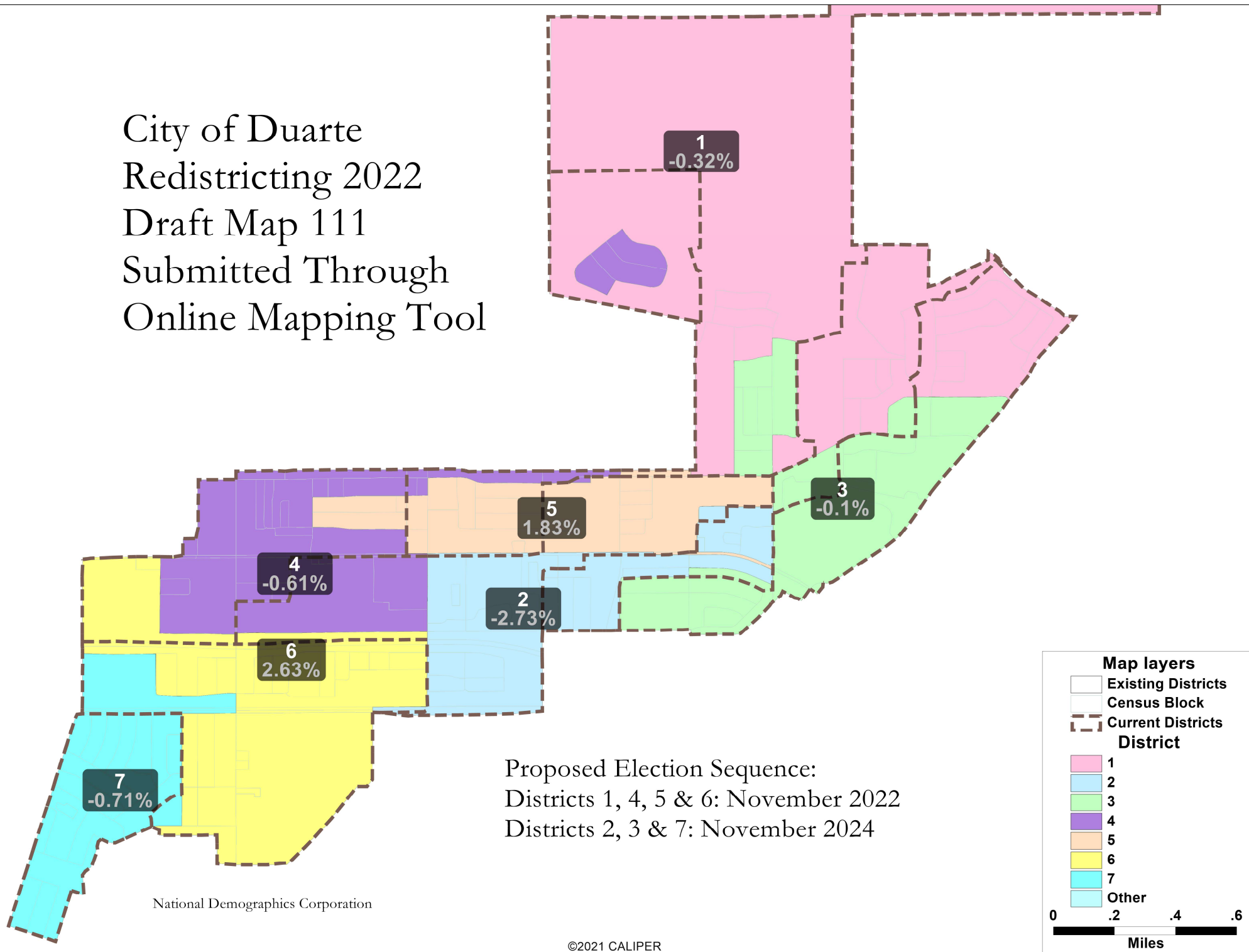

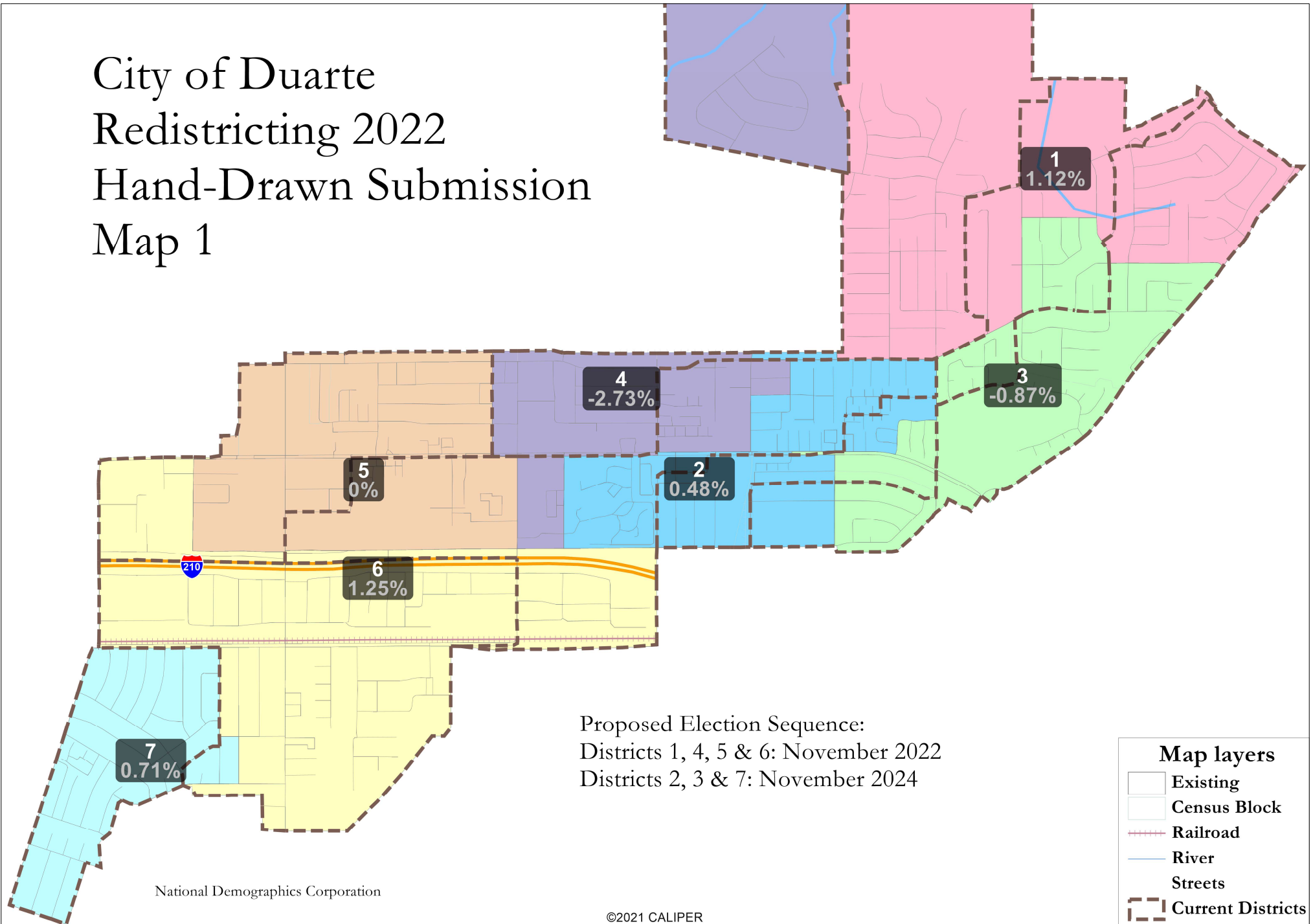

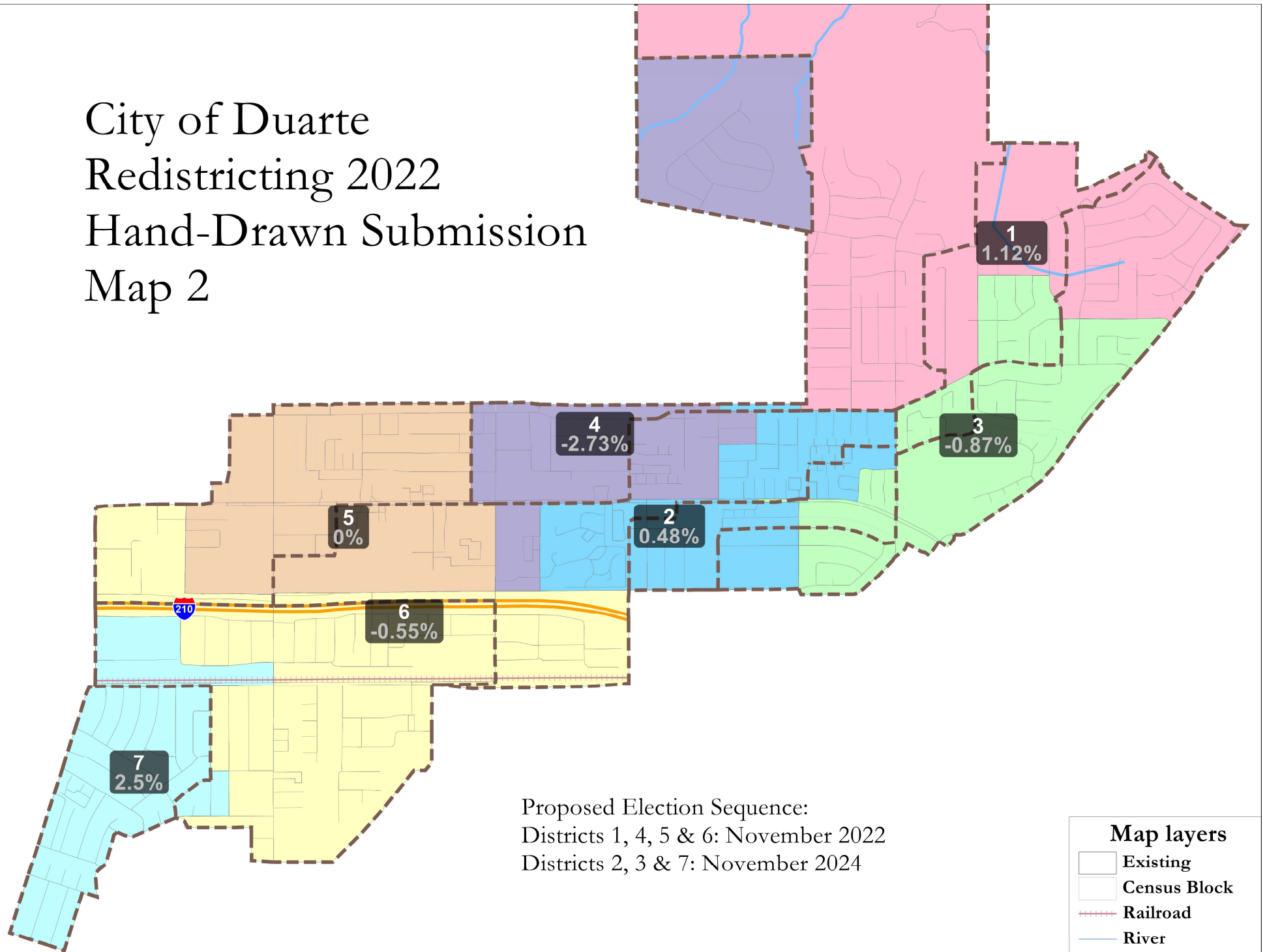

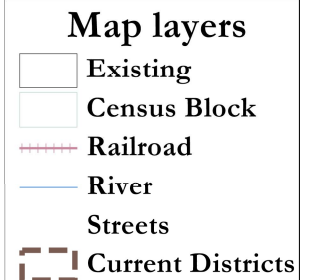
City of Duarte Redistricting 2022 Hand-Drawn Submission Map 1

ORDINANCE NO. 909

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUARTE, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2.02 OF THE DUARTE MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING BY-DISTRICT ELECTIONS AND ADOPTING A NEW CITY COUNCIL ELECTORAL DISTRICT MAP

WHEREAS, on December 4, 2017, the City Council of the City of Duarte (“City Council”) adopted Ordinance No. 877 establishing and implementing by-district elections; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Maps Act, specifically California Elections Code Section 21601 requires that following each decennial Federal Census, and using that census as a basis the City Council shall, by ordinance or resolution, adjust the boundaries of any or all of the City Council districts of the City so that the districts shall be substantially equal in population and in compliance with the United States Constitution, the California Constitution, and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965; and

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2021, the Census Bureau shipped local 2020 Census data to the Governor and leadership of the State Legislature of California with an official population estimate of 21,727 residents for the City of Duarte; and

WHEREAS, the City’s retained demographer National Demographics Corporation (NDC) found that the City Councilmember district boundary map adopted in 2017 and population changes evidenced by the Census in the existing districts no longer met the criteria specified in the Elections Code Section 21601; and

WHEREAS, the City of Duarte and NDC conducted public outreach throughout September 2021 through April 2022 regarding the redistricting of City Councilmember districts; and

WHEREAS, throughout the foregoing process, the City of Duarte engaged in a significant amount of public outreach and engagement required by California Elections Code Section 10010 and the Fair Maps Act; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held six public hearings on September 28, 2021, January 11, 2022, February 8, 2022, February 28, 2022, March 8, 2022, and March 22, 2022, where the City Council received briefings from NDC relating to the redistricting process and State and Federal redistricting criteria outlined in the Fair Maps Act, including the California Elections Code and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, and heard public testimony; and

WHEREAS, at the March 22, 2022, regular City Council meeting, the City Council determined that Map 103 Revised, published by the City on March 11, 2022, is compliant with Elections Code Section 21601 and all other provisions of the Fair Maps Act and voted to direct City staff to prepare an ordinance to adopt Map 103 Revised; and

NOW, THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUARTE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Recitals above are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

SECTION 2. Map 103 Revised, attached hereto as Exhibit 1, and incorporated herein, is hereby adopted and determined to constitute the seven City Council districts in and for the City of Duarte as the “City Council District Map” codified in Section 2.02.02 of the Duarte Municipal Code. The City Clerk is directed to maintain a copy of the district map.

SECTION 3. City Council elections shall continue to be conducted “by-district” in the seven districts set forth in Exhibit 1. The term “by-district” shall mean one member of the City Council shall be elected from each district, by the voters of that district alone as defined in California Government Code Section 34871.

SECTION 4. Chapter 2.02 of the Duarte Municipal Code is hereby amended and restated as follows:

2.02.010 - By-district electoral system.

Pursuant to California Government Code Section 34886 and the schedule established in Section 2.02.030 of this Chapter, beginning in November 2018, members of the City Council shall be elected on a by-district basis from seven single-member council districts. The City's by-district electoral system shall be conducted in accordance with California Government Code Section 34871, Subdivision (a).

2.02.020 Establishment of City Council Electoral Districts.

A. Pursuant to Section 2.02.010 of this Chapter, members of the City Council shall be elected on a by-district basis, as that term is defined in California Government Code Section 34871, Subdivision (a), from the seven Council Districts described as follows, which shall continue in effect until they are amended or repealed in accordance with law:

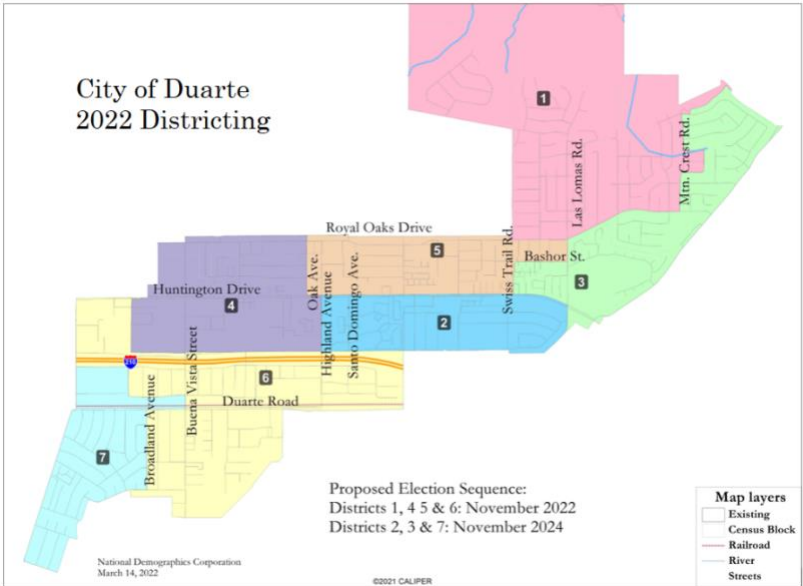
1. Council District 1 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Exhibit 1.
2. Council District 2 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Exhibit 1.
3. Council District 3 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Exhibit 1.
4. Council District 4 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Exhibit 1.
5. Council District 5 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Exhibit 1.
6. Council District 6 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Exhibit 1.
7. Council District 7 shall comprise all that portion of the City reflected in Exhibit 1.

B. Members of the City Council shall be elected in the electoral districts established by this section and subsequently reapportioned pursuant to applicable state and federal law.

C. Except as provided in Subdivision D herein and notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, once the ordinance from which this Chapter derives is fully phased in, each member of the City Council elected to represent a district must reside in that district and be a registered voter in that district, and any candidate for City Council must live in, and be a registered voter in, the district in which he or she seeks election at the time nomination papers are issued, pursuant to California Government Code Section 34882 and Elections Code Section 10227. Termination of residency in a district by a member of the City Council shall create an immediate vacancy for that council district unless a substitute residence within the district is established within thirty days after the termination of residency.

D. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Section, and consistent with the requirements of California Government Code Section 36512, the members of the City Council in office at the time the Ordinance codified in this Chapter takes effect shall continue in office until the expiration of the full term to which they elected and until their successor is qualified. At the end of the term of each member of the City Council that member of the City Council's successor shall be elected on a by-district basis in the districts established in this Section and as provided in this Chapter.

Exhibit 1: City Council District Map



2.02.030 Election Schedule.

Except as otherwise required by California Government Code Section 36512, the members of the City Council shall be elected from Council Districts 1, 4, 5, and 6 beginning at the general municipal election in November 2022, and every four years thereafter, as such council districts shall be amended. Members of the City Council shall be elected from Council Districts 2, , and 7 beginning at the general municipal election in November 2024 and every four years thereafter, as such council districts shall be amended.

SECTION 5. All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. The City Manager is directed to take all necessary steps to give effect to this Ordinance. If necessary to facilitate the implementation of this Ordinance, the City Manager or his or her designee is authorized to make technical adjustments to the election district boundaries that do not substantively affect the populations in the districts, the eligibility of candidates, or the residence of elected officials within any district. The City Manager shall consult with the City Attorney concerning any technical adjustments deemed necessary and shall advise the City Council of any such adjustments required in the implementation of the districts.

SECTION 7. The City Clerk is hereby directed to provide a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters for use in subsequent Duarte City Council elections.

SECTION 8. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, then such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council of the City of Duarte hereby declares the Council would have adopted this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that anyone or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions thereof be declared unconstitutional, invalid, or ineffective.

SECTION 9. This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after adoption.

SECTION 10. The Mayor shall sign this ordinance and the City Clerk shall attest and certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and cause this Ordinance to be published using the alternative summary and posting procedure authorized under Government Code Section 36933(c) by publishing the following:
